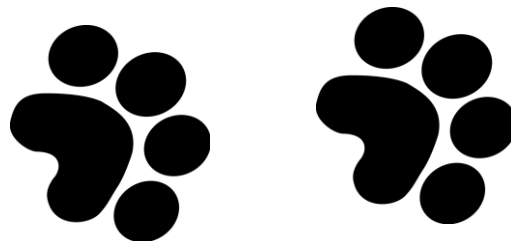

Scholarship Chair	George Gonzalez	An additional scholarship category was created this year for Special Education students. We are still fundraising for these scholarships, but to date have received \$4,000.00 from Circle K and Safeway. Polly is still working on the criteria for this new program with the Special Education Department and details will be announced soon. Grants	Kris Hardison	<p>There is money available in this account for clubs to use. If your club would like to apply for a Grant, follow the process listed on the PAWS website, under the Grants tab. Last year Band Fans received a Grant as well as the Special Education work experience. They purchased new recycling bins.</p> <p>Kris suggested that clubs apply for Grants soon as there is only \$ 7,000.00 available for this program, so it is first come first served. If you receive a Grant, as reminder that the money needs to be spent by the end of the fiscal school year. The Grants are to benefit the whole school. Grants cannot be used for uniforms. The approval process goes through the Principal and your club must show that you started fundraising for the items needed already or that you have plans to do so.</p>
UPC	George Gonzalez	<p>Monthly meetings are open to parents. Three things were mentioned in the Aug 16th meeting:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <i>Teacher Shortage</i> – This is a problem statewide, but PV District only has 18 vacancies (as of Aug 16) 2. <i>Enrollment</i> - This is determined after the 10th day of school. At the time of the meeting the district was down 350 students. A more accurate number will be reported after the next UPC meeting. 3. <i>Maintenance & Override Election Nov 7</i> – Someone from "Yes to PV Students" will come to the next PAWS meeting and share why this election is important. PAWS REPORT FROM BAND FANS

Well, Band has started hot and heavy already. The marching band started practicing in July four days a week, but with school starting it has dropped to twice a week and some Saturdays.

A big THANK YOU to PAWS for the grant last spring; we have acquired all the items that were discussed, carts, collapsible tent, water cart and bleacher covers. These have all been in use already, and everyone is thrilled. The band student council has made a thank you card for PAWS, signed by a number of students.

Uniform fittings were scheduled for August 12th, a Saturday. We had a great group of volunteers, including at least six students. We measured, fitted and altered uniforms for most of the band. For those that could not make it, we had another session on August 31st.

We set up our first concession stand during the home game last week with Paradise Valley. We covered our nut and came out with several hundred dollars profit, and do not have to spend much this week to restock. Thanks to Dina's Dogs and Kona Ice for their participation. Attendance was not as high as expected, but this could have been because of the Labor Day holiday. Still, we were pleased and everything went well.

This Friday, September 6, 2017 will be a home game with Westview HS. It's also Middle School Night, when we invite future band kids to play on the field with us, and participate in stand tunes. Senior band kids have been going to the middle schools for a few weeks, to mentor the younger musicians and practice stand tunes. Band Fans gives them tee shirts and they'll sit in the stands with the regular band.

Band kids also leave for Disneyland on Thursday Sept. 14th, arriving back home on Sunday Sept. 17th, about 4:30 am. They'll be working behind the scenes with Disney personnel, maybe march in a parade, eat a lot of sugar and have fun. (not sure what they'll be doing, if I'm honest).

Another home game and concession stand on September 22, with North High, and our first competition will be Saturday, September 30th. this will be for percussion only, with AzPas.

And that's enough for September.
